



MS IN APPLIED PSYCHOLOGY

Health Psychology | Human Factors | Industrial-Organizational

OVERVIEW

The Applied Psychology MS program at Clemson University is meant to prepare the next generation of critical thinkers to systematically tackle problems in applied fields of psychology. Students select one of three concentrations: Health, Human Factors, or Industrial-Organizational Psychology and complete 39 credit hours across two academic years. These programs are designed to provide the requisite theoretical foundations, skills in quantitative techniques and research design, and practical problem-solving skills necessary for either entering the workforce or continuing with a scholastic career.

KEY DATES

- Applications to the program are due through the graduate school application system by January 15.
- Students select a concentration during the application process.
- Applicants are notified of acceptance in the spring for a fall start.



APPLICATION COMPONENTS:

- A personal statement which identifies Clemson faculty with shared research interests
- A resume or CV
- Three letters of recommendation
- A TOEFL score is required for some international applicants
- All prior academic transcripts
- A writing sample (optional)
- GRE scores (optional)

ADMISSION AND PROGRAM INFORMATION:

- Typically, 2-4 students are accepted per concentration (12 students/year)
- Classes are in person
- Program does not prepare students for clinical practice
- Thesis and non-thesis options available
